BIG NEWS FOR WEST CRESTON IN THE NEAR FUTURE

Larry Binks is in the process of completing, the details for a contracted fire service to provide fire protection for West Creston /Creston Flats areas.

Watch your mailboxes for an information sheet regarding a purposed fire protection agreement for our community with the fire departments of the Town of Creston, Wynndel-Lakeview and Lister-Canyon.

At present, the BC Fire Ban Restriction status, for West Creston is **NO OPEN FIRES** permitted until Sept 20th. Only campfires that are not more than .5m in height and .5m in width, are allowed.

The fire hazard is at **extreme, please do your part to protect our community.**
