Here are the results of the elections and the West Creston Fire Service Referendum;

Director Area C

– Larry Binks (by acclamation)

School Board (Rural South) – Huscroft & Beebe (elected)

West Creston Fire Service Referendum -

146 Yes / 82 No (passed 64%)

Voter turnout was 58%.
